Creative Writing: Puck's Point-of-view Story



Imagine that you are Puck and you are telling the story of the mix-up with the love potion from your point of view:

- What happened?
- Why did everything go so wrong with the love potion from the magic flowers?
- How did Oberon treat you?
- What did you think of the lovers and the mix-up?

Remember to include:

- What you were doing in the wood in the first place (Oberon and Titania's argument)
- The flower you had to get
- The mistake you made firstly
- What happened next
- The reaction of the others (Demetrius and Hermia)
- How things worked out
- What Oberon said to you
- The eventual ending of the tale

Possible introduction:

So, I'm a fairy. Go on then. Laugh! Giggle! Everyone does. They think fairies are little girls with half a dress, a wand and pair of wings. How would they know? Let's get this right from the start. We are NOT cute tiny little girls in miniskirts. Fairies are spirits and we can take any shape we want. A huge monster, hairy spiders climbing up your nose, a flower – whatever we want. Midsummer's night is the most magical time and this Midsummer the human world got a little bit confused with the fairy world. I'll tell you what happened...

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
